1. Manhattan Bar, Regent Singapore Hotel, 1 Cuscaden Road, Level 2

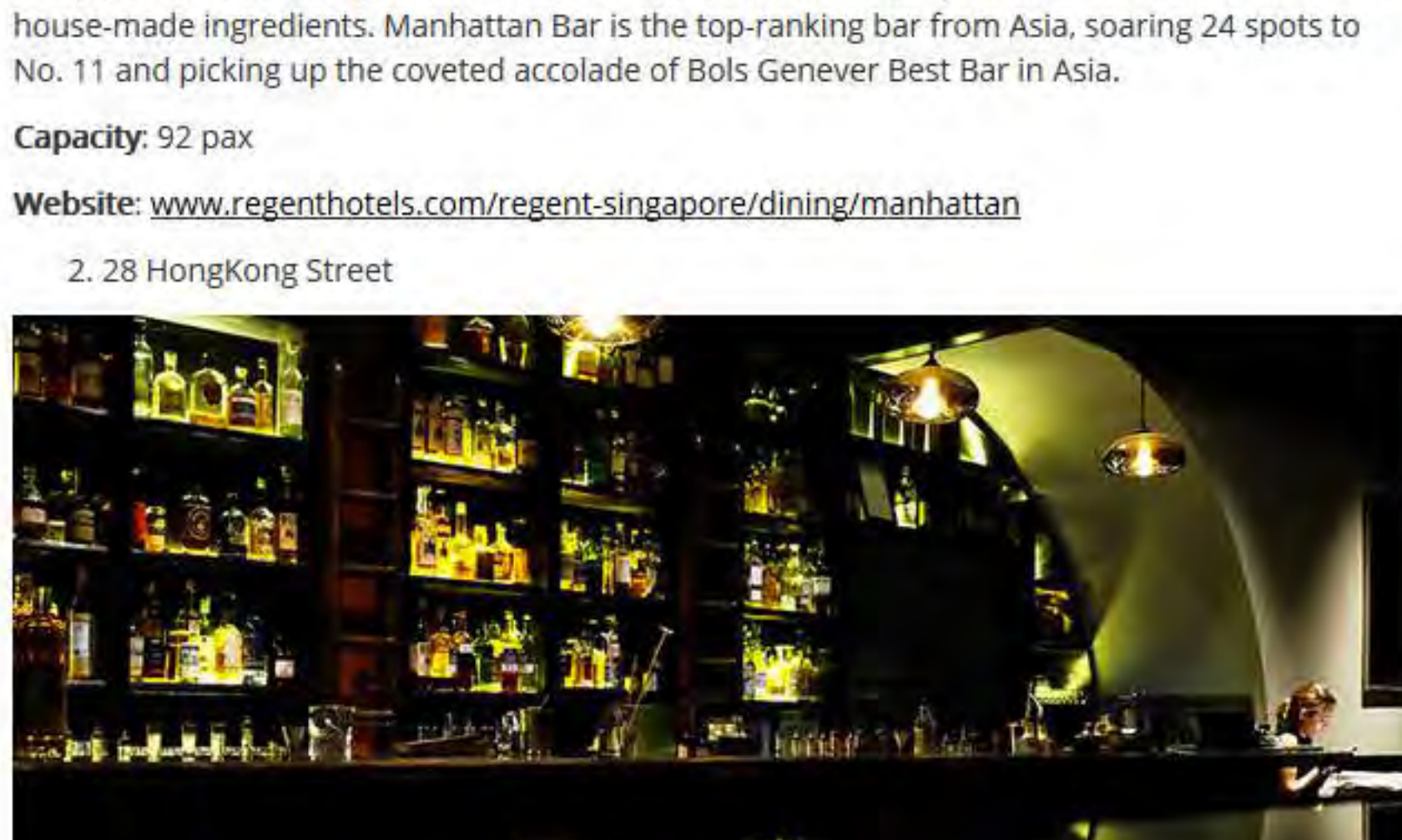

2. 28 HongKong Street

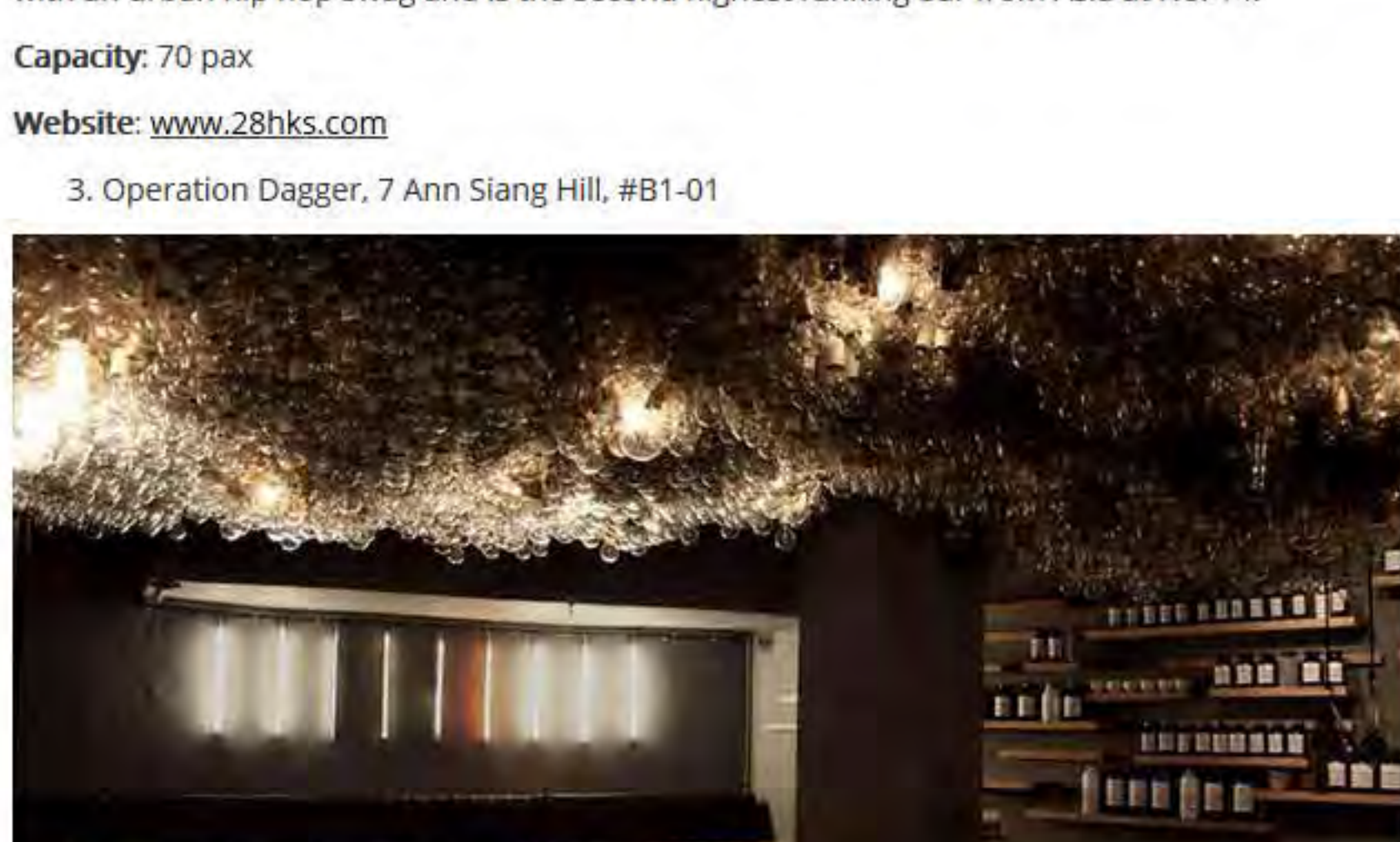

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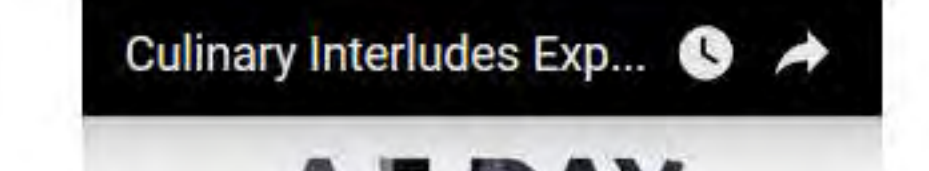
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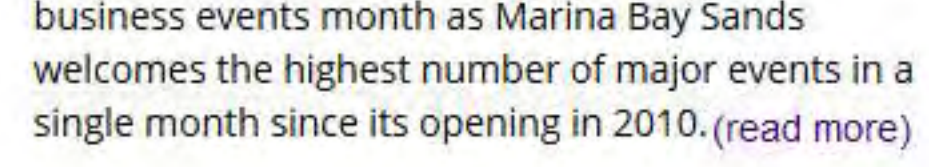
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
